Note. The full series of *The Jacobite* to 2016, in seven volumes bound in finest Morocco leather, can be referenced in The 1745 Association Library at the Callendar House Library and Archive, Falkirk. The Library / Archive is next to the Green Room, which is where I believe the Bonnie Prince dined with the Earl of Kilmarnock on September 14th 1745. The Hanoverian General Henry Hawley slept at Callendar House the night before the Battle of Falkirk Muir on January 17th 1746, and it was his HQ during the battle; and in the days following the battle it was used as a holding pen for Hanoverian prisoners.

The Callendar House Library is easily accessible from Glasgow or Edinburgh for any researcher wishing to use it for a day.

Introduction

The first edition of what has evolved into *The Jacobite* was published in 1954, at a price of two shillings, under the editorship of Dr George Pratt Insh CBE, under the title *Transactions of the '45 Association*. A second edition under his editorship was published in 1956.

Dr Insh was a distinguished historian in his own right, and these early editions have a definite academic flavour, including as they do scholarly papers by other leading historians of the day, including Sir Charles Petrie, Vice-President of the Association, on "Ireland and 45" and Cyril Hughes Hartmann on "Naval Operations in the 45".

Even in these early editions, three key characteristics were in evidence:

- an emphasis on first-hand evidence provided by the writings of participants in the Rising of 1745, with letters from Lord George Murray to his wife dating from the 1730s and 1740s published in the first two editions;
- an emphasis on previously under-researched aspects of the Rising; and
- a particular interest in the lives and destinies of individuals caught up in the Rising – from the beginning, the journal focused on the social and cultural history of the '45, rather than political, economic or military events, although these were also covered.

The second edition of the *Transactions* includes a full list of all the members of the Association as at that date, comprising 216 names, many familiar to Jacobite historians as leading members of families associated with this '45 as well as leading scholars, among them the Baron Porcelli, Alastair Livingstone of Bachuil and Sir Charles Petrie.

The *Transactions* ceased after 1956 following the death of Dr Insh, and the journal then went into abeyance for the next 12 years, until it was resuscitated in 1968 under the editorship of Barbara Fairweather under the title of *Quarterly Notes of the 1745 Association and National Military History Society*. These quarterly notes typically ran to no more than three or four pages and appear to have been typewritten and reproduced on a Gestetner or similar copying machine, so were far less formal than the original *Transactions*.

In the first edition of the *Quarterly Notes* published in February 1968, Barbara Fairweather set out her objectives as follows:

"Firstly, to build up archives of lesser-known material concerning Jacobite history in a wider sense (e.g. from approximately the time of Montrose, including incidents after 1746 which had any bearing on the Rising). The material I would be glad to receive from members for this purpose will include little-known anecdotes from old books, family papers and letters, or traditional tales handed down orally; legends or songs of the period; photographs of manuscripts, pictures and relics, or of places associated with Jacobite times. Thus, with our

members' help, we could create a store of Jacobite information, and sidelights on history, which might otherwise be irretrievably lost."

Barbara Fairweather's opening editorial comment remains a very fair summary of the mission of *The Jacobite*.

The *Quarterly Notes* did indeed appear quarterly between 1968 and 1973, but in 1974 the number produced fell to 3 per annum – in the winter, spring and summer, as in the current cycle of *The Jacobite* – although the length increased and the print quality of the journal also improved. The content of the notes continued to remain faithful to Barbara Fairweather's original mission statement, particularly in presenting obscure and previously unpublished first-hand accounts of participants in the '45, and the stories of individuals and families caught up in it, often written by their descendants. In some cases, these accounts extend back for many years before the Rising of 1745, to the English Civil War of the 1640s, giving a wider historical perspective to a conflict that affected several generations and in many cases defined the destiny of families who remained loyal to the House of Stuart over more than a century.

The first edition of *The Jacobite* in its modern form, as a bound A5 journal, appears as Edition No 65 in the winter of 1987, replacing the old A4 *Quarterly Notes*. In her introduction to the first edition of the new *Jacobite*, Barbara Fairweather noted that "numbering continues consecutively to avoid confusion when referring to the contents of earlier issues."

In its new format, *The Jacobite* continued to pursue its original mission, providing first-hand accounts of the Rising of 1745, analysing previously neglected aspects of the Rising, and commemorating lesser-known figures and events.

Barbara Fairweather (curator of the Glencoe Museum) stepped down as editor after a 26-year stint in 1994, making her by far the longest serving editor of the journal. She was succeeded by Anne Scholey, who sadly died prematurely in 1997. During her brief tenure as editor, Anne edited an important collection of some of the most interesting articles published over the previous 30 years in *A Jacobite Anthology*, which was published by The 1745 Association in 1995 to mark its 50th anniversary. In her introduction to the anthology, Anne wrote that,

"Our mission remains the same in 1995 as at our foundation in 1945: to keep green the memory of the brave men and women of the '45, to mark sites of Jacobite interest, and to further the enlightened study of history of the House of Stuart and the Jacobite period."

Anne Scholey was succeeded by Ross MacKenzie, who served as editor between 1997 and 2003 before ill-health forced him to step down, and he was followed by Archie Smith, editor between 2003 and 2005.

Peter Lole served as editor between 2005 and 2011, and under his editorship *The Jacobite* took on a somewhat more academic hue, with a number of important articles and papers published fully worthy of publication in research journals. By this time, the journal included a regular annual cycle that included reports of:

- every Annual Gathering,
- every annual commemoration at Culloden, and
- every Annual General Meeting of the Association.

Among the other innovations of this period was the publication of regular *Auction Notes* written by Dr Martin Kelvin, reporting prices and descriptions of Jacobite memorabilia sold at auctions across the UK. These notes provide an invaluable record of the evolving market for Jacobite artefacts, which is of immense value to collectors and dealers alike. Peter himself made a number of important contributions on Jacobite glass and Jacobite clubs of the 18th century, in which he is acknowledged as one of the world's leading authorities.

Peter was succeeded as editor of the *Jacobite* in 2011 by the current editor, Brian Whiting, who has continued the finest traditions of the journal in finding previously unpublished first-hand accounts of the Rising and unveiling new evidence about those swept up in it. Under Brian's editorship there was a particular focus on the music and songs of the Jacobite era, reflecting his particular area of interest and expertise. Sadly, Brian passed away suddenly in October 2017, at which time I assumed that there would be no Winter Edition of *The Jacobite* that year. However, at very short notice, another Council Member, the Rev Canon Dr Bob Harley, stepped into the breach and did an excellent job in carrying *The Jacobite* forward. He was very ably assisted by Susanna Silver, who revamped the design of the journal to bring it into the 21st century!

In 2017, along with the first Keeper of the 1745 Association Library, John McCulloch, I sought to collate as complete a sequence of all the journals as possible, going back to 1954, and between us we managed to track down all 157 editions published to that date (155 editions of the *Quarterly Notes* and *The Jacobite* and the two editions of the *Transactions* published during the 1950s). I would like to thank the following members of the Association who provided past editions of *The Jacobite* and its predecessor, the *Quarterly Notes*, to enable the collection to be put together. There is no record in *The Jacobite* of who served as the Association Treasurer prior to 1999.

Notes on individual editions

Transactions of the Forty-Five Association, 1954 and 1956

The very first edition of what became *The Jacobite*, and as such a document of immense historic interest and value to our Association, was published in 1954 under the title of *Transactions of the Forty-Five Association* and sold at a price of two shillings. It was edited by Dr. George Pratt Insh (1883-1956), a distinguished historian who had been awarded the CBE in 1944 for his services to education. His publications included *Scottish Colonial Schemes, 1620-1686* (1922) and *The Scottish Jacobite movement: A Study of Economic and Social Process* (1952).

The opening messages and letters of the Patron and President set out the mission of the Journal, which, as stated by Cluny MacPherson, is "to set on record, in the light of modern historical scholarship, the significance of the Jacobite movement.... against the far-stretching background of our country's history. Nor must we limit ourselves to political history: we must take into account the many aspects of our economic and social history."

Edition No 1 included an important analysis of Ireland and '45 by Sir Charles Petrie, and original letters from Lord George Murray to his wife dating from the 1720s and 1730s. The second edition, published in 1956, contains a continuation of the letters of Lord George Murray, covering the period between 1739 and 1744. It also contains the news that the editor, Dr Insh, had passed away.

Quarterly Notes, 1968-1987

The *Transactions* ceased after 1956 following the death of Dr Insh, and the journal then went into abeyance for the next 12 years, until it was resuscitated in 1968 under the editorship of Barbara Fairweather under title of *Quarterly Notes of the 1745 Association and National Military History Society*. Articles of interest in the *Quarterly Notes* include the following:

Edition No 6 (Summer 1969) contains an 1812 obituary of David Fraser, Piper to Simon Lord Lovat, who fought at the battles of Falkirk Muir and Culloden, and who died in December 1812 at the age of 96. It is reported that "the Honourable A. Fraser of Lovat, desirous to show every mark of respect to the remains of an old and faithful servant, ordered both his pipers to accompany the funeral, playing a mournful dirge; he also generously sent, to the burying ground, a sufficient supply of good Highland whiskey for the refreshment of those who attended the funeral."

Edition No 10 (Summer 1970) contains an article entitled "A Sideswipe at Scots Myth" by the Association's Secretary, Marion Cameron. This article describes the Association's efforts to collaborate with representatives of the *TV Times* in respect of an article they were running to support an eight part serial, *Redgauntlet*, in 1970. The article relates that

"when representatives of the TV Times visited Glencoe, they were courteously welcomed by Miss Fairweather, and enjoyed the hospitality of her home.... In due course the article appeared under the title 'Bonnie Charlie, Stay Awa'. Contrary to every assurance received by me, the writer, Colin Neil Mackay, submitted our members and all that the Association represents to abuse and ridicule as a "cult – stupid, misguided and more than occasionally hilarious", with the Prince written off as "a querulous, drink-sodden voluptuary." A further example of Mr Mackay's style was a scoffing reference to tourists and visitors to Scotland who "traipse around" historical sites and battlefields, while organisations which preserve such sites were blatantly assumed to do so for financial reasons only."

Marion Cameron's article is a reminder of the prejudices that the Association and others endeavouring to seek out the historical truth of the Rising of 1745 had to overcome in the 1960s and 1970s. She concluded that,

"journalism on this level cannot harm the great traditions of the Highlands, or the organisations which seek to preserve them...One interesting result of the article can scarcely have been intended by Mr Colin Neil Mackay – a spate of new applications for membership to the 1745 Association."

Edition No 14 (Summer 1971) marked an improvement on the print and production quality of earlier editions. It contained an interesting article on Charles Cameron, architect to Catherine the Great of Russia, as well as a fascinating article on military miniatures (toy soldiers) by Norman MacDonald, and the final part of a three-part series by Peter MacLow on Jacobite medals.

Edition No 16 (Winter 1971) included an article by Margaret McKerracher on Glasgow during the '45, containing a list of buildings and locations of Jacobite interest in Glasgow; and a review of a book by Norman MacDonald on the Clan Ranald of Lochaber. Norman was later to write the authoritative detailed history of the Clan Ranald.

Edition No 22 (Summer 1973) contains an article by Mairead McKerracher on John Grieg, who after Culloden escaped to the Norwegian port of Bergen, where he settled and married a local girl. His grandson, Edward Grieg, became one of Norway's greatest composers.

Edition No 28 (July 1975) contains an interesting article by Michael Barrington on a "Gallant Scots company in the service of France, 1692 - 1697", telling how officers and private gentleman who served with the King's Royal Regiment of Scots Horse, of which John Grahame of Claverhouse – Bonnie Dundee – was "the first and last Colonel" went into exile to France after the Revolution of 1688, where they served in the army of the French King. Part Two of Michael Barrington's article on the fate of Bonnie Dundee's regiment was published in No 29, reporting that "the Company was broken up in 1697; and little remained of it to be broken: sickness, privation, wounds and deaths having wiped out the greater number of these valiant Caledonians."

Edition No 30 (February 1976) contains a warm tribute to the Association's first secretary, Marion Cameron, following her retirement as Secretary in September 1975 after 30 years of

dedicated service since the Association's formation in 1946. Donald Cameron of Lochiel wrote that

"the Association would not have the strength or standing that it has today if it had not been for your unrelenting zeal on its behalf..... and blossomed into a strong and well recognised body, whose activities are welcomed by its members, and whose historical research is of inestimable value to students and historians alike."

Marion Cameron was succeeded as Secretary by Betty Stuart Hart.

Edition No 34 (May 1977) opens with the news that "this first article in this present quarterly (entitled "Scottish Gemstones and Jewellery") is by one of our Council Members, Miss Aikman.... (who) gave an excellent slideshow and talk at our Gathering in 1976 at Aberdeen and is again to do so this year." This was the first contribution by Christian Aikman, who was to be the mainstay of the Association for almost 40 years.

Edition No 50 (Autumn / Winter 1982) recorded the retirement of Mrs Betty Stuart Hart as Secretary of The Association, to be succeeded by Christian Aikman. Christian marked her appointment with an interesting article on "The 1745 and the Jacobite families of north-east Scotland."

The Jacobite, 1987-2017

The first edition of *The Jacobite* in its modern form, as a bound A5 journal, appears as Edition No 65 in the winter of 1987, replacing the old A4 *Quarterly Notes*. In her introduction to the first edition of the new *Jacobite*, Barbara Fairweather, its editor, noted that "numbering continues consecutively to avoid confusion when referring to the contents of earlier issues."

Edition No 65 contains a report by Marion F. Cameron, the Association's long serving secretary (for quarter of a century) of the unveiling of the Cairn on the shores of Loch Nan Uamh on October 4th 1956.

The principal article in **Edition No 68** (Winter 1988) is an interesting article by Betty Stuart Hart on Prince Charles Edward Stuart in Florence in the 1770s, together with a description of "the Prince's Weathervane" in Florence. It also includes a short article by Norman MacDonald on the Skirmish of Highbridge – many years later, Norman provided a fascinating guided tour of the site of the Skirmish during our Annual Gathering. No 68 also includes a biographical note on Charles Radcliffe, titular 5th Earl of Derwentwater, who was beheaded on Tower Hill on December 8th 1746.

Edition No 69 (Spring 1989) is notable for two articles by the two ladies who between them served as Secretary to the Association for well over half a century: Christian Aikman on the Seven Men of Moidart, and Marion Cameron, republishing an article written on Dr Archibald Cameron in 1953 to commemorate the bi-centenary of his execution.

The main article of **Edition No 71 (Winter 1989)** is an interesting account of the Jacobite Clubs of the Victorian era by Victoria Horley, showing how the romantic appeal of the Rising of '45 was sustained through the 19th century. It also includes an account of the escape from Hanoverian arrest in early 1745 (before Prince Charles landed on Scottish soil) of the Duke of Perth. NB: This is not to be confused with later accounts of his supposed escape to the North-East of England after Culloden – accounts fabricated, in my view, by fraudulent claimants to the Drummond Estates which had a monetary value (in today's prices) of close to £10 million.

The lead article of **Edition No 72 (Spring 1990)** is an important analysis of Jacobite songs by Murray Pittock, which occupies the entire issue. It contains one other article, being a brief eyewitness account of the Battle of Culloden by one Donald Mackay.

Edition No 73 (Summer 1990) has a particular focus on Cornish Jacobitism, including a song translated into English from Cornish, "The Gathering Song of the Cornishmen". It also includes an article assessing why the White Rose was adopted as the Jacobite emblem, and another on the colours of the Jacobite Army.

The Editor noted that **Edition No 74 (Winter 1990)** marked the first occasion when the report of the Annual Gathering (written by Christian Aikman, the honorary secretary of the Association) had been included in the body of the Journal, rather than issued as a separate booklet. This is invaluable in keeping a record of Gatherings since then. This edition also includes an extract from the memoirs of Sir Oswald Mosley – the second baronet of Ancoat, not to be confused with the interwar Fascist leader! – on Prince Charles Edward Stuart's sojourn in Manchester.

Edition No 75 (Spring 1991) is dominated by two important articles: one on James II of England (VII of Scotland) by John Gregerson, and the other on the northern England Jacobite clubs of the 18th century by Peter Lole, which includes a classification of Jacobite glasses and a comprehensive list of the 18th-century clubs.

Edition No 76 (Summer 1991) includes the annual report for 1991, an article on Crieff during the '45, and an article on the three Lindsay brothers by their descendant, Ronald Alexander Lindsay.

Edition No 77 (Winter 1991) includes a report by Christian Aikman on the Annual Gathering in Skye in 1991, and the minutes of the AGM held at Portree on August 30 1991. It also contains an article by Peter Lole on whether Prince Charles visited Manchester in 1744 (the evidence seems inconclusive), and a follow-up by M.G. Selkirk to his earlier article on Crieff, containing information on notable recruits from the town, including James Drummond, Duke of Perth, and John Caw.

Edition No 78 (Spring 1992) includes articles on Dr Archibald Cameron by Victoria Thorpe and Randal MacDonnell by Marion Cameron.

Edition No 79 (Summer 1992) includes the annual report for 1992, and an intriguing article on the fate of Lord Balmarino's Durk (dirk), which was later acquired by Robert Burns.

Edition No 80 (Winter 1992) includes an article by Malcolm Selkirk on Hugh Mercer, who served as a surgeon to the Jacobite Army at Culloden before escaping to America where he founded the city of Philadelphia, dying of his wounds at the Battle of Princeton in 1777. It also includes an article by Betty Stuart Hart on the fate of Lord Lovat's mortal remains. This very full edition also includes Christian Aikman's report of the 1992 Annual Gathering.

Edition No 81 (Spring 1993) includes information on a memorial service to Dr Archibald Cameron to be held at the Queens Chapel of the Savoy in London submitted by Sonia Cameron Jacks, an article on a mysterious visitor to Dr Cameron on the morning of his execution (Thursday, June 7th 1753), and an important article by Peter Lole on the Scottish Jacobite Clubs.

Edition No 82 (Summer 1993) includes a 1905 article by William Kirk Dickson on a Jacobite incident in 1719, an 1883 article on the Jacobites in Manchester in 1745 and the 1993 Annual Report.

Edition No 83 (Winter 1993) is dominated by the report of the Annual Gathering at Stirling and the 1993 AGM.

Edition No 84 (Spring 1994) includes an obituary of the Association's long serving secretary, Marion Cameron, by Louie Donald "almost a founder member herself, as she joined the Association as a young schoolgirl in 1948." It also includes the text of a talk by Peter Lole on Jacobite Glass and a paper by Edward Corp on the Royal Household at St Germain-en-Laye.

Edition No 85 (Summer 1994) includes articles on a Jacobite medal struck in 1752, and the sacrifice of Roderick MacKenzie, who gave his life to enable Prince Charles to escape capture by the redcoats, and a letter from Catherine Stuart, Lady Nithsdale, to her mother Lady Traquair dated December 26th 1745.

Edition No 86 (Winter 1994) brings news of the resignation of Barbara Fairweather from the post of Editor, after 26 years of service. It also includes articles on a Jacobite medal and a controversy regarding Jacobite glass.

Edition No 87 (Spring 1995) includes a biographical note on Alexander Forbes, 4th Lord Pitsligo, and an important article on Jacobite portraiture by Robin Nicholson.

Edition No 88 (Summer 1995) contains an article by Michael Sharp on coins and medals associated with Charles I; a report on the acquisition of an important portrait of Patrick Grant, the Culloden veteran who lived to 110, painted in 1822 by Colvin Smith (it currently hangs in the SNP Gallery No 4); and an article of a portrait reputed to be by Allan Ramsay of Flora MacDonald.

Edition No 89 (Winter 1995) includes a report on the annual gathering and AGM at Glenfinnan in 1989, and an extract from the diaries of John Maclean, a Jacobite soldier during the '45.

Edition No 90 (Spring 1996) includes an important article on Jacobite tartan by Peter MacDonald, and an essay on the Jacobite historian Walter Biggar Blaikie by Betty Stuart Hart.

Edition No 91 (Summer 1996) focuses particularly on Culloden, where exceptionally the Association held its Annual Gathering in April 1996 to commemorate the 250th anniversary of the Battle. It also includes an assessment by Norman MacDonald on what might have happened had the Jacobites decided to advance onto London from Derby instead of retreating. On the basis of a balanced assessment of the evidence, Norman concludes that they may very well have been successful in toppling the Hanoverian government. In the final paragraph of his essay, he writes, "What sort of king Prince Charlie would have made had his house been restored is a matter of speculation; but if he were to be judged on his conduct during the Rising, particularly up until Derby, he would surely have proved a just and tolerant monarch." I was fascinated by this, having independently come to the same conclusion prior to reading Norman's paper.

Edition No 92 (Winter 1996) gives a report on the "mini gathering" of Autumn 1996 (shorter than usual because of the 250th commemoration at Culloden earlier in the year). The lead article is on Roderick MacKenzie by Sonia Cameron Jacks.

Edition No 93 (Spring 1997) opens with the sad news that the editor of the Jacobite, Anne Scholey, had lost her battle with cancer. The opening tribute states that "Anne had fought bravely against cancer which was diagnosed shortly after she had attended our 1996 Culloden Gathering. She edited the last three issues of *The Jacobite* under considerable difficulty, but was much helped in this task by her mother, Kathleen Scholey." The main article by Peter Lole discusses a rumoured visit of Prince Charles to Cheshire during his "lost years" after the Rising.

Edition No 94 (Summer 1997) includes an article on a miniature portrait of Sir John Hay acquired by the SNPG, and an obituary notice of Anne Scholey by Christian Aikman.

Edition No 95 (Winter 1997) is largely taken up with a report on the annual gathering in Peebles, and a record of the annual general meeting. It also contains an article on the Erskines as Jacobites.

Edition No 96 (Spring 1998) includes an article by Christian Aikman on Alexander Cameron, the third son of John Cameron of Lochiel, regarding his conversion to Catholicism. Alexander, unlike his brothers Lochiel and Archibald, played little part in the '45.

Edition No 97 (Summer 1998) includes an obituary notice of Betty Stuart Hart, the Association's secretary between 1975 and 1982, and the full annual report for the year ending May 1998, including a record of the commemorative service at Culloden on April 18th 1998. It also includes an article on a visit to Stuart sites in Italy, including the Palazzo Muti, and an important, indeed definitive, paper on the Prince's Standard by Patricia Labistour.

Edition No 98 (Winter 1998) includes a record of the 1998 Annual Gathering and AGM at Pitlochry, an article on Ruthven Barracks by Norman MacDonald, and an article on William Murray, Lord Dunmore (cousin of the Marquis of Tullibardine) by Peter Lole

Edition No 99 (Spring 1999) includes a review of a book by the putative Prince Michael of Albany. The review, by Ross MacKenzie, is sceptical of his claim to be descended from Prince Charles. This edition also includes an account of the Battle of Killiecrankie and a detailed article on the life of the soldier poet, John Roy Stuart, together with some of his poems. Annoyingly, this paper is not credited, so its authorship is unclear.

Edition No 100 (Summer 1999) includes a record of the annual commemoration at Culloden and a list of sites of Jacobite interest commemorated by the Association, including most recently the cairn to John Roy Stuart erected in 1998.

Edition No 101 (Winter 1999) includes a detailed account of the 1999 Annual Gathering, an article on the Jacobite House of Touch by Peter Lole, and an account of the role of the Clan MacGregor during the '45 by Malcolm White.

Edition No 102 (Spring 2000) contains an article on Peter Grant, son of Patrick Grant, who lived between 1713 and 1824, and whose portrait was purchased by the SNPG in 1993. It also contains an article on a gold link bracelet, which reportedly was a gift from Prince Charles, although the author, Martin Kelvin, comments that "collectors of Jacobite memorabilia are only too well aware that true provenance in this sphere of activity is very difficult, if not actually impossible, to establish." The main article contains an assessment of whether Samuel Johnson was a Jacobite.

Edition No 103 (Summer 2000) contains details of the annual commemoration at Culloden in 2000, the Annual Report for the year to April 30th 2000, and an article by Peter Lole on chivalric honours bestowed by Stuart monarchs, both before and after their exile, to maintain and reinforce loyalty to the dynasty.

Edition No 104 (Winter 2000) is dominated by a lengthy account of the 2000 annual gathering held at St Germain-en-Laye in France, uncredited but presumed to have been written by Christian Aikman. It also includes an important article on the largely forgotten Jacobite bard, William Hamilton of Bangour, by Martin Kelvin.

Edition No 105 (Spring 2001) contains an appreciation of the life of Barbara Fairweather, long serving editor of the Jacobite. It also includes a scholarly article on the legal and cultural status of tartan after the Rising by Peter Lole.

Edition No 106 (Summer 2001) contains the annual report for the year ended April 2001. The main article is an interesting account of the role played by Faversham in Kent during the Jacobite Era.

Edition No 107 (Winter 2001) contains an account of the annual gathering at Coupar Angus, an account of the Blair Museum in Aberdeen with a particular focus on its Jacobite collection, and an account of the life of John, 3rd Lord Nairne.

The principal article in **Edition No 108 (Spring 2002)** is an account by Martin Kelvin of the "Finsthwaite Princess", the love child of Clementina Walkinshaw and Prince Charles Edward Stuart.

Edition No 109 (Summer 2002) is dominated by a review and article on the book by Peter Pininski regarding the descendants of Bonnie Prince Charlie. This edition also contains an article on the Gask Amen Glass.

Edition No 110 (Winter 2002) contains a report of the annual gathering and AGM held in the Isle of Skye in September, with the main feature article being an account of the bequest of the last of the Stuarts, Henry Benedict, and the fate of some of the major portraits in his collection since then.

Edition No 111 (Spring 2003) opens with news of the resignation of the editor, Ross MacKenzie, due to ill health. The lead article in this edition is on Mary Bruce Strange, by Victoria Thorpe.

Edition No 112 (Summer 2003) includes an account of the Culloden commemoration of 2003, with the main feature article being an account of the life and death of Dr Archie Cameron by Sonia Cameron Jacks.

Edition number 113 (Winter 2003) gives an account of the Annual Gathering at Penrith and the AGM of 2003, and includes an article on the life of Col Francis Towneley.

Edition No 114 (Spring 2004) includes articles on the Jacobite families of north-east Scotland during the '45, and an article on George Keith, Earl Marischal.

Edition No 115 (Summer 2004) includes the 2004 Annual Report; an article of the mid-18th century Stuart portraits at Traquair; an article on Field Marshal James Keith; and a talk by Peter Pininski on the secret of the last Stuarts.

Edition No 116 (Winter 2004) includes the report of the 2004 Annual Gathering and AGM in Aberdeen, the original text of the letter written by Lord George Murray to his wife Amelia dated September 9th 1745 setting out his reasons for deciding to join the Rising, and an article by Donald Stuart Brown on "Some Piobaireachd Tunes of the '45".

Edition No 117 (Spring 2005) includes an article by Christopher Duffy on the Culloden Memorial Project, and a feature article by Peter Lole on Traquair and the 5th Duke of Perth.

Edition No 118 (Summer 2005) includes the Annual Report for the year to April 30th 2005 and three major articles: one by Christian Aikman on the Seven Men of Glenmoriston; the second by Peter Lole on the Scots Colleges Overseas, including a directory of the colleges; and a third by Martin Kelvin on the Fight of Queen Clementina, providing a more sympathetic interpretation of her flight than some Jacobite accounts which take the side of her husband, the putative James VIII and III.

Edition No 119 (Winter 2005) contains the news that Archie Smith is standing down as editor of *The Jacobite*, to be replaced by Peter Lole. It also includes a report on the annual gathering at Fort Augustus, and the AGM held at Lovat Arms Hotel in September 2005, and articles by Norman MacDonald on the history of Invergarry Castle, and by Peter Lole on the old and new banks during the '45 (the Bank of Scotland and RBS).

Edition No 120 (Spring 2006) contains a reprint of Betty Stuart Hart's article on the historian Walter Biggar Blair, a riposte by Peter Lole to Martin Kelvin's conclusion that James VIII was guilty of infidelity to his wife Clementina (a charge which is at best unproven, and probably one of which James was innocent), and another article by Peter on the Hanoverian Kings' contribution to Jacobitism, with the Jacobite cause helped by the fact that the behaviour of Hanoverian monarchs frequently fell short of the standards that their subjects expected.

Edition No 121 (Summer 2006) contains the Annual Report for the year to April 2006, an article on the search for Dalchosnie, the seat of Sir John MacDonald, by Martin Galvin, and an update on the Culloden Battlefield Memorial Project by Christopher Duffy.

Edition No 122 (Winter 2006) is dominated by the account of the 2006 Annual Gathering at Grangemouth, and the minutes of the AGM held there. It also contains an article on the loss of the "Prince Charles" in 1746 by Ross McKenzie.

Edition No 123 (Spring 2007) includes the obituary of the Association's former Chairman, the Reverend Kenneth Wigston, and an important 10-page essay on the place of the Battle of Prestonpans in the Rising of 1745 by Dr Christopher Duffy.

Edition No 124 (Summer 2007) carries the news of the death of Ross MacKenzie, a regular contributor to, and former editor of, *The Jacobite*, at the age of just 47. It also contains, rather disconcertingly scattered through the journal, contemporary letters written by Mrs Anne Grant on the character of Lord Lovat and his son Simon, the Master of Lovat, who were evidently not among her favourite personages.

Edition No 125 (Winter 2007) is dominated by the account of the 2007 Annual Gathering at Inverness, and the minutes of the AGM held there. It also contains the first of the series of *Auction Notes* regularly contributed by Dr Martin Kelvin. This edition contains my first contribution to *The Jacobite*, a translation of the Memorandum sent by Prince Charles to King Louis XV on his return to France on November 5th 1746, requesting the King's assistance in raising another force in order to return to Britain as soon as possible. This Memorandum stimulated my own interest in the character of the Prince and history of the period, as it provided first-hand evidence contradicting Hanoverian propaganda that Prince Charles had abandoned Scotland after Culloden.

Edition No 126 (Spring 2008) carries news of the passing of another former chairman of the Association, Alastair Livingstone, Baron of Bachuil, at the age of 93. It also contains important articles on Robert Strange, the pre-eminent Jacobite engraver, by Victoria Thorpe; and on Neil MacEachain, the father of Napoleon's Marshall MacDonald, by Stephen Lord.

Edition No 127 (Summer 2008) includes an obituary of Alastair Livingstone, the annual report for the year to April 2008, and an article on John Rattray, the so-called "golping Jacobite".

Edition No 128 (Winter 2008) includes an obituary of the Association's President, David Lumsden of Cushnie, who died during the Annual Gathering at Glenfinnan that year. It also contains an account of the Gathering itself, and the first part of a two-part article on the executions of the Earl of Kilmarnock and Lord Balmerino at Tower Hill on August 18th 1746, drawing on contemporary accounts of that sad event.

Edition No 129 (Spring 2009) includes an account of the Lochiel Memorial Event held at Bergues in October 2008, and the second part of eyewitness accounts of the behaviour of the Earl of Kilmarnock and Lord Balmerino during their final days in the Tower of London.

Edition No 130 (Summer 2009) includes the Annual Report for the year to April 30th 2009, an article on the discovery of 13 Jacobite glasses from the Vaughan family of North Wales, and an article on the Welsh Jacobite Anthony Langley Swymmer.

Edition No 131 (Winter 2009) is largely taken up by a detailed account of the Annual Gathering in Edinburgh in September 2009, and the AGM held in September 2009. It also includes extracts from an 1822 letter by Anne Prichard, in which she recollects meeting Prince Charles in Preston in 1745, recording, "Oh, how I fell for him and child as I was, I seemed to know that sad trouble was before him. How I longed to be a man so that I might strike at least one blow for him and his lost cause." She goes on to relate a later meeting with him at Essex Street in 1752, in what appears to be important first hand testimony of key events in the Prince's career.

Edition No 132 (Spring 2010) carries an appeal for new officers following the resignation of the then Chairman, Secretary (Christian Aikman) and Treasurer (myself). This edition carries an article on the Teviotdale Jacobite, Henry Ker of Graden, by Christian Aikman. The edition is rich in first-hand accounts of the '45, containing as it does: [a] extracts from the diary of James Miller of Manchester, who was sentenced to death for his part in the Rising but pardoned; [b] a second letter from Anne Prichard of Preston written in 1822 and recalling events from 1745 and after; and [c] a letter from Duncan Robertson of Drumachuine to the Duke of Atholl dated January 11th 1746.

Edition No 133 (Summer 2010) includes the address given by Brigadier John M MacFarlane, President of the 1745 Association, at the annual commemoration at Culloden in 2010, which for me is the most powerful evocation of the battle ever spoken; and a poem by William Neill (1922-2010) entitled *John Roy Stuart*, in which he imagines the voice of the warrior poet in exile and yearning for the Highlands.

Edition No 134 (Winter 2010) includes a report of the Annual Gathering held in Peebles in September 2010, including an account by Dr. Christopher Duffy of the Prince at Peebles during his march southwards in November 1745. It also includes the minutes of the AGM held at Peebles in 2010. This edition also includes articles by Charles Burnett on the impact

of the '45 on the Lyon Court and John Holman on an exhibition of the relics of King Charles I in London in May 2010.

The main feature of **Edition No 135 (Spring 2011)** was the commemorative event to mark the 250th anniversary of the death of Lord George Murray in the small Dutch town of Medemblik, including the text of a speech on his life given by his direct descendant, James Murray.

Edition No 136 (Summer 2011) contains a notice of my own 2011 Edinburgh Fringe production of "The Last Hopeful Epistle of Bonnie Prince Charlie". This edition is mainly taken up by an important paper by Tom Adams on the involvement of the Lairds of North-East Scotland in the Rising of 1745, explaining why they rose for Prince Charlie and describing their fate after the Rising.

Edition No 137 (Winter 2011) includes an account of the annual gathering and AGM in Blair Atholl, an article setting out the text of the speech at the Annual Dinner delivered by Brigadier John MacFarlane on the songs and music of the '45, and another by Christian Aikman on the siege of Blair Castle in February 1746.

Edition No 138 (Spring 2012) records that Norman MacDonald was standing down as vice-chairman of the Association, having served the Association faithfully as Chairman for six years and Vice-Chairman for a total of 18 years at different periods. It also contains: [1] the news of a new Jacobite Gallery (Gallery No 4) at the Scottish National Portrait Gallery, [2] a short article by Christian Aikman on the origins of Drumbuie, [3] a detailed account of Jacobite operations in Blair Atholl by Christopher Duffy, and [4] the first article by Brian Whiting on the story behind the English Jacobite song, "Derwentwater's Farewell".

The main features of **Edition No 139 (Summer 2012)** are an article on James Russel, an English Jacobite artist; a report on the commemorative service on Drumossie Moor on April 14th 2012 by Christian Aikman; and an article on the 1964 BBC drama/ documentary on Culloden (Dir: Peter Watkins) by Brian Whiting.

Edition No 140 (Winter 2012) includes an account of the Annual Gathering and AGM at Derby in September 2012 - believed to be the largest, in terms of number of attendees, held to date - along with an account of the life of Dougal Graham, the Jacobite Bard, and an account of the song "The Bonnie Blue", both by Brian Whiting.

Edition No 141 (Spring 2013) contains a varied range of articles including [1] a brief summary of the career and execution of Sir John Wedderburn; [2] an article by Stanley Morris on the Stuarts in Rome; [3] an article by Arran Johnston on the Prestonpans Tapestry; [4] an article by Tom Adams on the Manchester Regiment and [5] a contribution on The Skye Boat Song as part of the series of articles on songs of the Jacobite Rising.

Edition No 142 (Summer 2013) contains a short letter Eveline Cruikshanks questioning the role that Dudley Bradstreet played in the fateful decision to retreat from Derby, arguing that he "sexed up" the dossier and that he did not actually reach Derby before the Council of War dispersed. This tends to reinforce my own view that Bradstreet's account is self-

serving, not supported by other evidence, and that he exaggerated his influence at what is arguably the key event during the Rising – namely the Council of War at Derby. Most of this edition is dedicated to the commemorative service on Drumossie Moor held on April 13th 2013, including in particular the oration there by Sheriff John MacLeod. It also includes the republication of a 1988 article by Betty Stuart Hart on Prince Charles in Florence.

Edition No 143 (Winter 2013) is mainly dedicated to an account of the Annual Gathering in September 2013, which included visits to Balnamoon and Cortachy Castle, and the minutes of the AGM. It also includes an account of "The Golfing Jacobite", John Rattray, by Brian Whiting.

Edition No 144 (Spring 2014) includes a detailed account of the efforts of the National Trust for Scotland to preserve the integrity of the Culloden battlefield site, including correspondence from the Chairman of the 1745 Association supporting the NTS's position. This edition also includes an article by Peter Lole on the recent discovery of a 1745 portrait of Prince Charles by Allan Ramsay; an account of a Jacobite exhibition at Fairfax House, York; and the first part of an account of Aberdeen during the '45 by Tom Adam.

Edition No 145 (Summer 2014) includes the text of the 2014 oration at the commemorative service on Drumossie Moor, and the text of a poem to "My Dear and Only Love" by James Graham, 5th Duke of Montrose.

Edition No 146 (Winter 2014) is largely dedicated to an account of the 2014 Annual Gathering and the minutes of the 2014 AGM. It also includes an account of the 1745 Commemoration at St George's Gardens.

Edition No 147 (Spring 2015) contains three important articles: the first on Michael Ignatius Brown by Martin Kelvin; the second on Charles Stuart in Italy after 1766 by Stefano Baccolo; and the third on Gordon of Glenbucket and his role in the '45 by Glen MacDonald.

Edition No 148 (Summer 2015) contains the text of the oration given at the annual Culloden commemoration in April 2015 by Prof Matthew MacIver; an account and photographs of the unveiling of the plaque to the Kennington Martyrs at St George's Gardens; and "Reflections on Rome", a personal account of the visit by the 1745 Association to the Eternal City in May 2015 by Brian Whiting.

Edition No 149 (Winter 2015) includes an account of the 2015 Annual Gathering in Argyll, and the minutes of the AGM held on September 4th 2015. It also includes an account of the Stuart Court in Rome, drawing on Edward Corp's presentation to the Association in Rome in May 2015, and an important article on the banning of tartan ("myth or reality?") by leading tartan expert Peter Elsea MacDonald.

Edition No 150 (Spring 2016) includes accounts of two important anniversaries: the commemoration of the 300th anniversary of the Battle of Sheriffmuir in November 2015, and the commemoration of the 270th anniversary of the Battle of Falkirk Muir held on January 16th 2016. It also includes further reflections on the 2015 Annual Gathering in Appin, with an account of the death of James of Glen.

Edition No 151 (Summer 2016) includes accounts of the 270th anniversary of the Battle of Culloden held at Drumossie Moor and addressed by Hugh Cheape, and at St George's Gardens in London organised by The 1745 Association. This edition also includes an account of the so-called "Battle of Goudhurst" between the Hawkhurst Gang and government authorities on April 21st 1747.

Edition No 152 (Winter 2016) opens with a tribute to the Association's long serving secretary, Christian Aikman, who passed away at the age of 93 in July 2016. The rest of the edition is largely taken up with an account of the 2016 Annual Gathering in Cumbria, and the minutes of the 2016 AGM. It also includes an account of the life and career of the Hanoverian officer Sir Robert Munro of Foulis, founder of the Black Watch, who fell at the Battle of Falkirk Muir.

Edition No 153 (Spring 2017) contains updates on the efforts to preserve the battlefields of Culloden and Sheriffmuir, an account of finding a 1745 musket ball at Highbridge by armourer Paul MacDonald, an account of the restoration of the MacDonald of Kingsburgh tartan by Peter Elsea MacDonald, and a carefully researched consideration of the causes of the early demise of Ann Livingston, Countess of Kilmarnock, from postgraduate research undertaken in the 1970s by Barbara Graham.

Edition No 154 (Summer 2017) includes the oration at the 271st anniversary of the Battle of Culloden held at Drumossie Moor on April 15th 2017, and biographical notes on the Jacobite John Hamilton by Anne Dean.

Edition No 155 (Winter 2017) sadly included tributes to two stalwarts of the Association, the Editor of the Jacobite, Brian Whiting, and former Chairman Norman H MacDonald, both of whom had passed away during the autumn. It also included an interesting article by Glen MacDonald and Jim King on the possible location of Cluny's Cage, identified during an expedition to Ben Alder during the Summer.

Edition No 156 (Spring 2018) included news that a new home had been found for the 1745 Association Library, appropriately at Callendar House at Falkirk, which played a major role during the Rising. It was where Prince Charles Edward Stuart dined with the luckless Earl of Kilmarnock during his march southwards in September 1745, and subsequently served as the headquarters of General Henry Hawley, the Hanoverian commander, before the battle. This Edition also includes a number of articles relating to the inauguration of memorials to Falkirk Muir, including an article on the battle by Roy Beers, the speech delivered by the current Glengarry, Patron of the Association, when he unveiled the Plaque to Young Glengarry organised by Glen MacDonald and marking the entrance from the Falkirk High Street into the Falkirk Old Church where Young Glengarry's mortal remains are interred, and an article on Glengarry during the Rising by his successor, Ranald MacDonell of Glengarry.

Edition No 157 (Summer 2018) included proposals to amend the Constitution of 1745 Association, now incorporated as a company limited by guarantee, with a view to securing

charitable status as well as limited liability for the Association subject to AGM approval, and to ensure that its governance is in line with corporate best practice for charitable organisations.

Thanks are due to John Nicholls MBE, President of The Fifteen, The Northumbrian Jacobite Society, for having assisted in collating a complete series of the Society's eponymous journal from the date of its inception to 2018 for public research at the 1745 Association Library.

The Fifteen Northumbrian Jacobite Society was founded in 2000 with a particular focus on the Rising of 1715 and the leading role played during the Rising by Northumbrian Jacobites, including the James Radclyffe, 3rd Earl of Derwentwater (1689-1716) and his younger brother Charles, the titular 5th Earl (1693-1746), both of whom paid the ultimate price for their loyalty to the House of Stuart on Tower Hill.

The first three editions of *The Fifteen* comprise a dozen pages or less, resembling the early *Quarterly Notes* of The 1745 Association in providing news about the Society, its members and its events. However, following the appointment of John Nicholls as the Journal's Editor from the fourth edition onwards, it increased to between 50 and 60 pages in length.

The Fifteen is produced once a year and typically incorporates three or four feature length articles, as well as details of forthcoming Society events and reports of the Society's AGM and Annual Dinner. As in the case of *The Jacobite*, the journal focuses particularly on personal histories of those caught up in the Jacobite Wars and their wider social and cultural impact. Always beautifully produced and illustrated, *The Fifteen* sheds light on aspects of Jacobite history and heritage that are frequently neglected or overlooked by conventional histories of the era.
