1982	Dalilea House, Loch Shiel	Plaque	<i>Home of the Gaelic Bard Alexander Macdonald</i>
1988	Cille Choirill Church	Plaque	<i>Two plaque to Colonel Alexander Macdonald, 17th Chief to Major Donald Macdonald of Tirnadris</i>
1990	Kinlochmoidart	Cairn	<i>Seven Men of Moidart</i>
1994	Speanbridge	Cairn	<i>Action at Highbridge</i>
1998	Kincardine – Speyside	Cairn	<i>John Roy Stuart (1700-1752)</i>
2000	Sancerre de Berry	Plaque	<i>Plaque marking the house in which Lord Nairn lived in exile. [Alliance France Ecosse also donated to plaque].</i>
2002	Sheriffmuir	Cairn	<i>Battle of Sheriffmuir, 1715</i>
2003	Callendar, South Ancaster Square	Plaque	<i>Plaque to the memory of James Drummond, Duke of Perth (1713-46)</i>
2005	Cairn Tree Site, Brampton, Cumbria	Plaque	<i>Plaque in memory of six Jacobites executed in 1746, fixed onto an existing stone cross (1904)</i>
2012	Flodigarry, Isle of Skye	Plaque	<i>Plaque marking the home of Flora MacDonald at Flodigarry Cottage where she lived between 1751 and 1759, and where five of her seven children were born</i>
2015	St George's Gardens, Kings Cross, London	Plaque	<i>Plaque commemorating those put to death on Kennington Common in 1746</i>
2015	Castlegate, Aberdeen	Plaque	<i>Plaque commemorating the involvement in the '45 of Jacobites from the area.</i>
2018	Falkirk Trinity Church	Plaque	<i>Plaque commemorating the accidental death of young Glengarry near this spot in the aftermath of the Battle of Falkirk Muir (1746)</i>
2018	Falkirk Muir	Plaque	<i>Major series of interpretive plaques and a commemorative bench to interpret the Battle of Falkirk Muir (January 17th 1746) in a programme led by The 1745 Association and Callendar Estates, the landowner</i>
2019	Craggan Hotel, Kyle of Tongue	Plaque	<i>Plaque commemorating the capture of Le Prince Charles (formerly HMS Hazard) on March 25th 1746, and the gold on it sent to help the Jacobite cause</i>

- 1992 Dr Archibald Cameron: plaque in The Savoy Chapel, London. The Clan Cameron and The Royal Stuart Society.
- 2001/2 Seat in Kilmuir Cemetery Skye: Legacy of £500 from the estate of Miss Barbara Fairweather, late of Glencoe. She was the first editor of "Quarterly Notes".

- 2008 Bergues, Normandy: Cairn and plaque in memory of the Gentle Lochiel, jointly with the Alliance France Ecosse, Marquis of Montrose Society, Royal Stuart Society.
- 2019 Restoration of the Grants of Sheuglie Graveyard at Drumnadrochit, including the grave of Patrick Grant, veteran of the '45.
